September 6, 2023 Meeting Minutes - Unapproved

1. Opening and Call to Order:

The NICC Monthly Membership meeting was called to order by John Stupec at 7:01 p.m. with 30 members present in the meeting room and one on Zoom for a total of 31 members in attendance.

- <u>3. Introduction of Guests:</u> Jan Pausteck attended the meeting tonight. She is a future Corvette owner and is looking for a black convertible, 2008 or newer. Leon Gorsch met her at the Roscoe Car Show and invited her to the meeting.
- **4.** <u>Minutes:</u> A motion was made to approve the August, 2023 minutes by Sherry Putnam and seconded by Gene Stimart. The motion was approved.

5. Monthly Reports:

<u>President</u> – John Stupec: John asked each member of the Board if they would be willing to continue to hold their position in 2024. Three positions were then left open. These were Parade Director, Sergeant-at-Arms and Webmaster. Traci Hill stated that she will take over the Webmaster Position.

Dale mentioned that Joan Thomas had advised him that Mad City Corvette Club does membership renewals on their website and there is a "Members Only" tab which has information that only our club members can access. These would be features to consider as we begin to upgrade the NICC website in November.

<u>Membership</u> – Leon Gorsch: Leon distributed renewal applications to members. The deadline for renewals for 2024 is October 15th. NCCC requires this deadline. If the deadline isn't met, the cost for renewal is an additional \$10. At this time we have 85 members.






10 Things You Probably Didn't Know About Historic Route 66

US Highway 66, or "Route 66," is the country's first all-weather highway, passing through several states for 2,400 miles. This expansive highway has hundreds of sites recognized on the National Register of Historic Places. That means that there are tons of great stops to see along the way, making it one of the most famous road trips in the US!

10. Route 66's Nickname Is The "Mother Road"

Route 66 was also nicknamed "The Main Street of America," but its other nickname was coined by John Steinbeck. Steinbeck proclaimed Route 66 as the "Mother Road" in his novel, The Grapes of Wrath. The 1939 novel follows the story of the Joads, a family who traversed Route 66 from Oklahoma to California.

The novel was a critically-acclaimed work of art, earning its title as an American classic, winning a Pulitzer Prize, and being adapted into a 1940 film (of the same title). Thanks to Steinbeck and his coining of the nickname, Route 66's reputation grew to the status of America's most iconic drive.

9. Cyrus Stevens Avery Was The "Father Of Route 66"

Tulsa business person (and chair of the state highway commission), Cyrus Stevens Avery, wanted major (and better) roads to pass through his home state of Oklahoma. In 1926, his proposal for a highway that connected Chicago to Los Angeles via a southwestern route was approved.

Avery was also known for founding the US 66 Highway Association and coining Route 66's nickname, "The Main Street of America."

8. The Original Number Of Route 66 Was "60"

One of the most interesting things to know about Route 66 history is that it wasn't always "66". When Avery's proposal for a massive east-west route was approved, it was originally proposed as Route 60. However, there was a dispute about the original proposal name among eastern states.

Specifically, Kentucky's Gov. Williams J. Fields persisted that Route 60 is a name that should be reserved for a highway spanning Springfield, Missouri, to Newport News, Virginia. To resolve the dispute, the Chief Engineer for the Oklahoma Department of Highways proposed that the east-west route be named "Route 66," which sounded catchy.

7. Route 66 Inspired Pop Culture

Route 66 is among the most famous road trips in the world. The road is even known by those who've never driven on its path! For decades, this historic route inspired works of art, including music and television.

The iconic route inspired the 1946 hit song Route 66 (created by Bobby Troup and sung by Nat King Cole), as well as the 1960s television series Route 66 (starring Martin Milner, George Maharis, and Glenn Corbett).

5. Part Of Route 66 Could Sing

4. There Is A Bridge On Route 66 That "Bends"

Located above the Mississippi River, this mile-long bridge connecting Madison, Illinois, to St. Louis, Missouri, was once a vital landmark for travelers along Route 66. In 1996, the Chain of Rocks Bridge reopened as a part of the Route 66 Bikeway and is since been open only to pedestrian and bike traffic. The bridge is notable for its 30-degree bend at its midway, which was designed with a purpose.

way was repaved, and signs about the musical highway were removed.

Originally, the bridge was meant to be built in a straight line. However, in doing so, the bridge would cross an area of the river's bedrock that could not support the weight of its bridge piers. River captains also argued that if the bridge were built in a straight line, its piers would be built near two water intake towers for the local pumping station, which would be a nightmare for vessels or barges navigating through the waters (as they would have to navigate around the piers and the water towers simultaneously).

3. Many People Traveled On Route 66 During The Great Depression

During the Great Depression, Route 66 experienced a huge surge in the traffic of migrants searching for jobs and opportunities who were negatively impacted by severe droughts in the early 1930s (which negatively

affected farmland due to the formation of dust storms).

Over 200,000 refugees traveled on Route 66 toward Arizona or California, impacted by the times and seeking better opportunities and employment in these states. Many of these refugees hailed from states like Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Missouri.

2. Travelers Can Ride Arizona's Only Mountain Coaster!

Travelers can see Arizona's only mountain coaster that's right on Route 66! Located in the Williams' Canyon Coaster Adventure Park, this thrilling coaster includes twists, dips, turns, and drops along a mile-long, 35-foot-tall track on the mountainside.

This ride is a thrilling attraction for families and one of the best stops on a Route 66 road trip for those who find themselves around William, a city in Northern Arizona that's a "Gateway to the Grand Canyon!"



This park is just as historic as Route 66 since there are over 800 archeological and historic sites within the property, which covers more than 13,000 years of human history. The park even has displays of animal and plant fossils that go back over 200 million years!

2024 Corvette E-Ray Is First-Ever Front-Wheel Drive Vette

The eighth-generation C8 Corvette is a collection of firsts for the iconic performance nameplate, and the latest 2024 Corvette E-Ray continues the theme as the first-ever production Corvette equipped with a hybrid powertrain, as well as the first-ever production Corvette equipped with all-wheel drive. Notably, the C8 Corvette E-Ray is also the first-ever production Corvette equipped with front-wheel drive. Wait... what?



We'll explain. For those readers who may have missed it, the 2024 Corvette E-Ray mates a mid-mounted V8 with a front-mounted electric motor, the conjunction of which offers all-wheel grip. However, in addition to hybrid electric-gasoline power, the E-Ray also includes a new Stealth Mode, which relies solely on the front-mounted electric motor to move the E-Ray.



Stealth Mode is a good option for those 2024 Corvette E-Ray customers looking to stay in the good graces of their neighbors when leaving early in the morning, or those customers that want to travel short distances (up to 45 mph) without turning over the V8. However, it also means that when operating in Stealth Mode, the 2024 Corvette E-Ray is technically front-wheel drive.

Not that customers will necessarily point to that fact for bragging rights. Still, it's interesting that the hybrid powertrain enables the Vette to be a front-wheel-drive electric vehicle, at least in the technical sense.

As for the gasoline-powered part of the equation, the new E-Ray features the naturally aspirated 6.2L V8 LT2, the same powerplant that powers the C8 Corvette Stingray. Rated at 495 horsepower and 470 pound-feet of torque, the V8 teams up with the front-mounted motor to produce a maximum of 655 horse-



power, with the V8 driving the rear wheels via Chevy's dual-clutch eight-speed automatic transmission (RPO code MLH), and the electric drive motor responsible for the front axle. The front motor is powered by a 1.9 kWh battery pack that recharges under normal driving conditions.

As a reminder, the 2024 Corvette E-Ray rides on the GM Y2 platform, with production taking place at the GM Bowling Green plant in Kentucky.

Here's Why The 2019 Chevy C7 ZR1 Is The Best Corvette Ever

The 2019 Chevrolet Corvette C7 ZR1 is one of the craziest track weapons out there, and it's the best 'Vette ever, too.

Chevrolet took the entire world by storm back in 2019 with the release of one of the most extreme American performance cars in existence - the Corvette C7 ZR1. At the time, nobody realistically thought that the C7 Corvette could get any better than the 2015 Z06 - especially with the all-new C8 right around the corner, but Chevy had one more surprise up its sleeve.

In the glorious ZR1 fashion of old, the bow-tie American manufacturer unveiled the 2019 Corvette ZR1 as the perfect sendoff for the C7 generation, packing enough performance to hold its own against the likes of the Ferrari 488, Lamborghini Huracán, and McLaren 720s.

Not only is the C7 Corvette ZR1 the most powerful Corvette ever produced - even more so than the current C8 Z06, but it's also the last front-engined Corvette we'll probably ever see, with the new mid-engine generation marking the model's future path. Here's why the 2019 Chevrolet C7 ZR1 is the best Corvette ever produced.

The 2019 Corvette ZR1's Engine Is Utterly Insane

The regular 2014 C7 Corvette is already pretty impressive in its own right, equipped with a new-at-the-time LT1 small block 6.2-liter V8 that produces 455 horsepower and 460 pound-feet of torque, allowing it to accelerate from 0-60 mph in a healthy time of just 3.8 seconds. Then, things got significantly crazier when Chevy unleashed the 2015 Corvette Z06, powered by a supercharged 6.2

-liter LT4 V8 that bumped its output to a maximum of 650 horsepower and an equal amount of torque. That meant that the Z06 had received almost 200 extra horsepower and torque over the regular C7 Corvette, enabling a greatly reduced 0-60 mph acceleration time of 3 seconds flat. The 2015 Corvette Z06 is also capable of running the quarter mile in less than 11 seconds at 127 mph, putting it well in the territory of overseas supercar rivals.

But, the story doesn't end there, and four years later, when people were already beginning to question if the C7 would ever receive the ultimate ZR1 package, Chevy delivered in insane fashion. The then all-new 2019 Corvette C7 ZR1 emerged with an enhanced LT5 engine, a modified version of the Z06's powerplant with a gigantic supercharger that's 64% larger than that of the LT4. As a result, the C7 ZR1 delivers a maximum output of 755 horsepower along with 715 pound-feet of torque, making it the most powerful Corvette in existence. Available with either a 7-speed Tremec rev-matching manual or an 8-speed automatic, the 2019 Corvette ZR1 can blast from 0-60 mph in just 2.8 seconds, while able to achieve the standing quarter mile in less than 10 seconds.

Everything About The C7 Corvette ZR1 Is Nuts

To keep the 2019 Corvette ZR1's thirsty supercharged engine happy, Chevy had to incorporate both port and direct fuel injection, as well as a whopping total of 13 radiators to keep it from overheating. Suspension-wise, the ZR1 features front and rear double-wishbone cast aluminum suspension along with transverse-mounted composite springs. The vehicle also comes with Magnetic Selective Ride control, which is a form of adaptive suspension that changes damping settings between three different drive modes: Touring, Sport, and Track.

Additionally, the C7 ZR1 has one of the craziest set of wheels imaginable - specially-made Michelin Pilot Sport Cup 2 tires with run-flat technology and barely any tread whatsoever. Pair all that together along with extremely responsive and precise steering, and you've got yourself a vehicle that's just as eager to fling itself into corners as it is to blast in a straight line.

The 2019 Corvette ZR1 also features an extra-cost ZTK aero package, which includes a giant high-fixed rear wing, carbon fiber splitter end caps, as well as the aforementioned run-flat summer tires, and magnetic ride control. The ZTK package allows the ZR1 to produce up to 950 pounds of downforce at top speed, granting the sports car extreme handling poise.

The 2019 Corvette ZR1 Is The Last Of Its Kind

While some may be in favor of the new Corvette C8's mid-engine configuration, it's undeniably true that one of the most enticing and historic characteristics of the Corvette has always been its long-hood front-engine setup. Changing that inevitably feels somewhat unsettling, but at the same time, it makes the 2019 Corvette ZR1 even more special. It's probably the last Corvette we'll ever see with a front-mounted mill, and in the eyes of many, that makes it the last purebred, true Corvette.

Boiling things down, the 2019 Chevrolet Corvette C7 ZR1 marks the end of a truly legendary era, and nobody could have imagined a more fitting sendoff than an ultra-aggressive 750 hp machine that can tear up the track and your local drag strip. The future of the Corvette badge definitely looks promising, and we'll surely see an array of extreme models pop up as time goes by, but it'll be hard to beat the rawness of the C7 ZR1.


